POGO CHAIR IN CHILDHOOD CANCER CONTROL/MEDICAL DIRECTOR

Description

The POGO Chair in Childhood Cancer Control is a top level, visionary leader who works with hospitals, researchers, government, parents and survivors to develop new policies that take a “big picture”, evidence-based approach to

- Treating children with cancer
- Helping their families
- Preventing cancer
- Allocating diminished health care resources
- Developing new research programs

The Chair simultaneously serves as POGO’s Medical Director and works to integrate and coordinate the Ontario Childhood Cancer Control System.

Current Chair

Dr. Mark Greenberg is the Medical Director for POGO and the first POGO Chair in Childhood Cancer Control. Dr. Greenberg is a Senior Oncologist at The Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto and a Professor of Pediatrics and Surgery at the Faculty of Medicine, University of Toronto. He served as President of POGO for ten years and was the first Canadian elected to the North American presidency of the International Society for Pediatric Oncology. In 2001, Dr. Greenberg received the Order of Canada in recognition of his work in pediatric oncology.

Future

The position is a five-year renewable term. Future Chairs could be appointed to Queen’s University, the University of Ottawa, McMaster University, the University of Western Ontario or remain at the University of Toronto.
