

POGO Financial Assistance Program (POFAP)



For families of children with cancer

POFAP can help your family with the cost of food, accommodation and child care during your child's cancer treatment

What is POFAP?

POFAP is a program available to assist Ontario families with out-of-pocket expenses when a parent accompanies a child to hospital during active cancer treatment and care. Funding is provided for accommodation when treatment takes place away from home, food and child care for siblings under the age of 12.

Who is eligible?

All Ontario families with a child in treatment for malignant disease, who feel that they need financial help, are eligible to access this program. POFAP supports Ontario residents who:

- have a valid OHIP number
- are diagnosed with cancer prior to their 18th birthday

This assistance is available during active treatment plus the first 3 months of active follow-up, until the child's 19th birthday, up to a lifetime maximum of \$10,000.

How can POFAP help?

Food Allowance

- \$15.00/day for food when a child is admitted overnight at the hospital.
- \$7.50/day for food during an outpatient visit (minimum of 4 hrs including travel time) at the hospital.

Accommodation

- \$10.00/night for Ronald McDonald House.
- \$20.00/night if other paid accommodation is necessary.

Child Care

- Assists with the cost of child care for siblings under the age of 12 while a parent takes a child to cancer treatments. Child care provided by a family member cannot be claimed.
- Provides a maximum of 120 hours of care per year at the rate of \$8 per hour, starting from the date of the first child care claim.

How do I register?

A Social Worker or POGO Interlink Nurse at your child's treatment centre will help you complete a registration form which will be sent to POGO for processing. You will receive an information letter with your POFAP identification number, which must be included on all of your POFAP claim forms.

POFAP is administered by POGO through Ontario's specialty pediatric oncology programs located at:

- Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario
- Children's Hospital, London Health Sciences Centre
- Kingston General Hospital
- McMaster Children's Hospital
- The Hospital for Sick Children

How do I submit a claim?

Obtain claim forms from your POGO Interlink Nurse or Social Worker at your child's treatment centre, then complete and return claim forms to the centre on a monthly basis. Claim forms are also available at www.pogo.ca.

Please submit claims on time. Forms with claim dates more than three months old cannot be processed.

What if my child is transferred to another hospital?

If your child is transferred to another hospital for cancer treatment, you may continue to make claims. Your child's POFAP file will be transferred to the new treatment centre and your claims can be processed at the new hospital. Families in the POGO Satellite Clinic Program will continue to submit claims at their child's treatment centre.
