The Position

We are seeking a health care professional from the childhood cancer community with systematic review experience to join our Clinical Practice Guidelines Program. This position will support development of POGO's clinical practice guidelines and other evidence-based materials as well as help facilitate the development of implementation tools and conduct impact assessments. Specifically, the successful candidate will:

- Work as part of a team to conduct systematic reviews including title and abstract screening, full-text screening, data-extraction, risk of bias assessments and meta-analyses;
- Draft sections of systematic review and clinical practice guideline manuscripts, where appropriate;
- Participate on clinical practice guideline panels and other related working groups, as needed;
- Work as part of a team to facilitate the development of implementation tools and to evaluate the impact of POGO's clinical practice guidelines.

About You

- You must have methodologic knowledge of and experience in conducting systematic reviews of the scientific literature;
- You are a health care professional with clinical experience in pediatric oncology working as a member of a multidisciplinary team (recent or current practice is an asset);
- You have strong organizational and communication skills.

Logistics

This position will be part-time, 2 to 3 days per week (negotiable), the majority of which will require a presence in POGO's Toronto office. If needed, a secondment is possible.
