WHAT IS A POGO SATELLITE CLINIC?

The Pediatric Oncology Group of Ontario (POGO) Satellite Program is a networked, shared-care system based on a partnership between Ontario's five tertiary hospitals and eight POGO Satellite Clinics. POGO Satellite Clinics are located in community hospitals and allow families to receive care closer to home.

POGO and Children's Hospital, London Health Sciences Centre collaborated to create the POGO Pediatric Oncology Satellite Clinic at Windsor Regional Hospital. This POGO Satellite Clinic helps families by reducing travel time, loss of income and separation from your home and community, while maintaining confidence that your child is receiving the best quality care, under the direction of Children's Hospital.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES CARING FOR THE WHOLE CHILD

In addition to pediatricians and nurses, our satellite team includes the services of a psychiatrist, social worker, dietitians and a child life specialist.

Child life specialists are certified professionals who aim to reduce stress and anxiety associated with hospital visits. They become an integral part of each child's journey and also incorporate the services of a magician and ventriloquist; they provide pet therapy, music and art therapy, and a Beads of Courage Program. Also available is the Kids Beating Cancer: Honourable Little Ninjas Martial Arts Program. Referrals to other health care specialists are available for patients who live in the Windsor Regional Hospital catchment area.



YOUR CHILD'S FIRST SATELLITE VISIT

Children's Hospital will coordinate a meeting with the Outreach Program Coordinator prior to your child's discharge. The Outreach Program Coordinator will arrange for the sharing of your child's health information with the POGO Satellite Clinic. You will be contacted by the POGO Satellite Clinic to receive further information and schedule your first appointment.

Please bring your child's health card and a list of all medications and doses.

It is a good idea to bring any special objects to comfort your child and help with any wait times. This will help make your child's visit as comfortable as possible.

During your initial meeting you will have an opportunity to meet with your POGO team and tour the inpatient unit.

IF YOUR CHILD HAS A FEVER



Fevers in children being treated for cancer need prompt assessment. Call the POGO Satellite Clinic immediately if:

- Your child has a single temperature of 38.3 degrees Celsius or higher (taken by mouth) or a temperature of 38 degrees Celsius or higher (taken by mouth) for 1 hour or more.
- Your child has a single temperature of 37.8 degrees Celsius or higher (under the arm) or a temperature of 37.5 degrees Celsius or higher (under the arm) for 1 hour or more.
- · You are not sure what to do.
- · You have questions.

PLEASE NOTE:

Temperatures taken by mouth are more reliable and the preferred practice.
