

## 4.7 Clinical Circumstances that Warrant Consultation with the Specialized Childhood Cancer Program

It is anticipated that some pediatric oncology patients under care in POGO Satellite Clinics will experience treatment complications and/or deterioration in health status which will be an indication to transfer to the appropriate specialized childhood cancer program. The list below is an attempt to highlight conditions which, when present or suspected, should prompt consultation with and possible transfer to the patient's specialized childhood cancer program.

All patients may be seen for initial antibiotic therapy/stabilization before transfer to the appropriate specialized childhood cancer program. Also, blood product administration, if needed, should not be delayed while arranging transfer.

1. Complex [fever and neutropenia](#)
  - a. Patients with high-risk diseases or on high-intensity protocols (such as AML, post-stem cell transplant or induction phase of treatment).
  - b. Patients presenting with sepsis syndrome.
  - c. Patients with persistent fever beyond 5 days or return of fever after period of defervescence.
  - d. Patients with presumed surgical focus (such as recent surgery, appendicitis and typhlitis).
  - e. Evidence of significant local infection (such as tunnel infection, peri-rectal abscess or cellulitis).
2. Potential interstitial pneumonitis/pneumocystis pneumonia or pleural effusion
3. Pericardial effusion, heart failure or superior vena cava syndrome
4. Intracranial bleed or suspected increased intracranial pressure
5. Seizures or unexplained or new neurological symptoms
6. Spinal cord compression
7. Bowel obstruction
8. Uncontrolled bleeding
9. Concern of relapse or progression of tumour
10. Acute renal dysfunction
11. Acute hepatic dysfunction

*Note: Bone marrow aspirates, tumour biopsies and diagnostics such as bronchoscopy are **not** to be performed in the POGO Satellite Clinic as the procedure will be repeated by the specialized childhood cancer program.*
